



IREAD-3: Frequently Asked Questions

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1. 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2. Must students who have been in the U.S. for less than one year and who will take LAS Links also participate in IREAD-3?	Yes.												
3. What is the expectation for schools whose Spring Break is scheduled for the same week as the IREAD-3 assessment?	Schools scheduled to be on Spring Break during the IREAD-3 assessment window must complete and submit the <i>Assessment Date Change Request</i> form to the IDOE at least three months prior to the established assessment window.												
4. Will IREAD-3 be administered <i>in addition</i> to ISTEP+ at grade three?	Yes. Separate from ISTEP+, IREAD-3 is the assessment Indiana uses to measure reading skills as part of the implementation of PL 109.												
5. Will IREAD-3 still be administered once ISTEP+ is replaced with the Common Core Assessment in 2014-2015?	As long as PL 109 is in place, a reading assessment will be required.												
6. Is IREAD-3 a section of ISTEP+, or does it replace the reading portion?	Neither, as IREAD-3 is a separate assessment. It does <u>not</u> replace any portion of the existing ISTEP+. Grade 3 students must participate in both ISTEP+ <i>and</i> IREAD-3.												

7. How long does it take to administer IREAD-3?	<p>IREAD-3 is comprised of three test sessions, all of which may be administered in one day, or throughout the appointed 3-day assessment window, as determined by the local school or district. 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8. Does IREAD-3 consist of only multiple-choice items?	Yes. Located on the IDOE web site, the <i>IREAD-3 Item Sampler</i> features the different types of multiple-choice questions that could appear on IREAD-3.

10. Will IREAD-3 results be reported in sufficient time to plan for summer intervention if needed?	IREAD-3 results are expected to arrive in schools the first week of April.																									
11. Are there any guidelines / expectations for schools and corporations relating to IREAD-3 remediation?	Under State Board rule, schools must provide additional intervention(s) for students who do not pass IREAD-3. The structure and timeline of such interventions are to be determined at the local level and based on student needs.																									
12. What happens in a situation where ISTEP+ ELA results differ from IREAD-3 results?	While IREAD-3 and ISTEP+ ELA both measure reading comprehension skills, they differ in that ISTEP+ ELA also assesses language arts standards; IREAD-3 assesses foundational reading skills <i>only</i> . Because the assessments are not identical, some differences in results should be expected.																									
13. Will <i>only</i> IREAD-3 results count when making decisions regarding access to grade four reading instruction?	Yes.																									

14. What are the consequences for students who do not pass IREAD-3? Is the decision to do so going to be governed by local control?	In accordance with PL 109, students who do not pass the Grade 3 reading assessment (IREAD-3), will continue to receive instruction in Grade 3 Reading, will be officially reported as a third grader, and will fully participate in the Grade 3 ISTEP+ assessment. It is the responsibility of the local school to design a program that meets the learning needs of students. There are a few exceptions to this rule (refer to the <i>Good Cause Exemptions</i> ; see next question).																		
15. How will the results of IREAD-3 be used for accountability?	The rule currently being considered by the State Board of Education for A-F category designation does not, at this point, include IREAD-3.																		
16. What are the Good Cause Exemptions and which students are eligible?	The Good Cause Exemptions include: <div><div>1.</div><div>Students who have previously been retained two times prior to fourth grade.</div></div> <div><div>2.</div><div>Students with disabilities whose Case Conference Committee has determined that promotion is appropriate.</div></div> <div><div>3.</div><div>English Learner students whose Individual Learning Plan (ILP) Committee has determined that promotion is appropriate.</div></div>

Is IREAD-3 administered online or using paper-and-pencil formats?</p>	<p><u>Spring 2012:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • IREAD-3 will be administered using a paper-and-pencil format. • IREAD-3 pilot test forms will be administered in paper-and-pencil and online formats. <p><u>Summer 2012:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • IREAD-3 testing will be administered online. • A paper-and-pencil test will be available only as an accommodation per a student's IEP.
<p>19. When / how will IREAD-3 pilot schools be identified and notified? Will schools have an opportunity to volunteer?</p>	<p>Pilot schools will be selected based on specific demographic criteria in order to fulfill the requirement for a representative sample. Information about pilot schools will be shared with Corporation Test Coordinators.</p>
<p>20. Has the state decided what defines "reading level"? Lexiles for example?</p>	<p>The IREAD-3 assessment measures foundational skills in reading through grade three. As with all of our state assessments, a committee of Indiana educators recommended a passing or "cut" score to the State Board of Education; the State Board approved the recommended cut score at their August 2011 meeting. Meeting expectations for "reading level" were determined by the cut score.</p>
<p>21. Will IREAD-3 follow other state assessments with allowable accommodations that must be addressed in the IEP, Section 504 Plan, and/or an ILP (EL plan)?</p>	<p>As with all of our state assessments, the IREAD-3 test administration includes accommodations. See Appendix C of the 2011-2012 ISTEP+ Program Manual (www.doe.in.gov/assessment/iread_resources.html) for specific information.</p>
<p>22. When is the summer retest window?</p>	<p>The window is June 25 – July 27, 2012. Online test administration may begin on June 13. More details will be shared as they become available.</p>
<p>23. Will retest opportunities be offered throughout the school year?</p>	<p>IREAD-3 retest opportunities will occur in the summer.</p>
<p>24. Which students participate in the summer retest?</p>	<p>The IREAD-3 Summer Retest is for Grade 3 students who:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • did not pass IREAD-3 in March and have since been provided remediation in reading • were absent during the March window and need to take IREAD-3 for the first time

IREAD for K-2: Frequently Asked Questions

Question	Answer
1. Will schools be required to administer the IREAD K-2 assessments?	IREAD-K, IREAD-1, and IREAD-2 were created to help schools monitor student progress and provide appropriate instruction prior to grade three. Schools may choose to use these “no-stakes” assessments, which provide teachers with the feedback necessary to track student progress and to make instructional decisions that will help ensure student success on IREAD-3.
2. When will the IREAD K-2 assessments become available to schools?	The assessments will be available for operational use in Spring 2012.
3. How do schools sign up to take the IREAD K-2 assessments?	There is no need to sign-up for these assessments, as they will be made available on a secure web site for access by Corporation Test Coordinators.
4. Will any costs to schools be associated with the IREAD K-2 assessments?	Costs will likely include those associated with printing and scoring the assessments at the local level.
5. Will the IREAD K-2 assessments be given to students online or will they be administered to students by the teacher individually or whole group with pencil-and-paper?	IREAD-K, IREAD-1, and IREAD-2 will be administered in paper-and-pencil format. Most assessments will be administered to individual students by their teacher.
6. How frequently are the IREAD K-2 assessments administered?	As IREAD K-2 assessments are summative in nature, they are designed to be administered once during the last 4-5 weeks of the school year in each participating school corporation.
7. How can I learn more about IREAD K-2?	IREAD-K, IREAD-1, and IREAD-2 item samplers will soon be posted on the IDOE’s website and in the Indiana Literacy Liaison Community of the Learning Connection. Look for more information soon!

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
